


New Pharmacy Contractors guidance document (New!)

Community Pharmacy Workforce Survey 2023 (CPWS23) (Reminder!)

The <u>Community Pharmacy Workforce Survey 2023</u> launched on the 23rd of October 2023 and will close on Sunday the 17th of December.

This annual survey is part of the community pharmacy regulations since 2022 and provides consistent, accurate data to support effective workforce planning. The survey is being conducted by North of England Commissioning Support Unit (NECS) on behalf of NHS England.

Free lateral flow device tests available from community pharmacy for eligible patients (NEW!)

COVID-19 lateral flow devices are now available free of charge from participating community pharmacies for patients who are potentially eligible for COVID-19 treatments.

This will replace the online and telephone ordering service via GOV.UK and 119, which ceases on 15th November 2023.

The service is visible in <u>NHS Profile Manager</u>. Participating pharmacies are encouraged to ensure their profile is up to date, so patients and other health care professionals can check NHS.uk to access the service.



Funding for the foundation training year 2025/26 (NEW!)

As part of the implementation of the reforms to the Initial Education and Training of Pharmacists, NHS England is <u>harmonising the funding available to all foundation</u> training sites hosting a foundation trainee pharmacist (previously pre-reg <u>pharmacist</u>).

Each site employing a foundation trainee pharmacist in the 2025/26 training year will receive £26,500 per foundation trainee pharmacist.

The funding will be consistent across all sectors of practice and all regions of England and provide a contribution to all costs of hosting a trainee, including supervision, administration and salary.

Smoking Cessation service: E-cigarette & Vouchers (NEW!)

Core Smoke Free advisors (CSF) will now be recording e-cigarettes (E-Cig) on the Health Manager system. This occurs when a client requires this product as part of their quit attempt with us.

The CSF advisers can also add NRT medications in addition to the e-cigarette, which means that both products will be visible on the voucher when generated by the CSF advisers.

If you do see a voucher with both NRT and the e-cigarette listed, as per the example below, please can we ask you to select/change the 'Supply Given' to '0' for the 'E-Cig' medication. You will continue to supply and redeem the NRT medication/s on the voucher as normal.
