

Look Alike Sound Alike (LASA) drugs- Promazine and Promethazine

"Promazine" and "Promethazine" can easily be confused and are available in the same strengths. Promazine is a phenothiazine-type, first generation (typical) antipsychotic with relatively weak antipsychotic activity but pronounced sedative effects. The BNF suggest that this drug is "less suitable" for prescribing due to its high toxicity in overdose and side effect profile. It is not on formulary in Kent and Medway and is also not on the KMPT (mental health trust) formulary so should rarely be seen in practice.

If you receive a prescription for promazine and you have not supplied it to that patient before, please consider the risk of prescribing error during your clinical checks and contact the prescriber for clarification where appropriate.

EPS token submission and factsheet

Community Pharmacy England has published a new <u>factsheet</u> to help pharmacy teams familiarise themselves with Electronic Prescription Service (EPS) token submission requirements.

The factsheet outlines which tokens must be sent to the NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) as part of their end-of-month submission, including those for paid or exemption declarations and Pharmacy First consultations, and which are not required, such as those for age-exempt patients and where exemptions have been confirmed by Real Time Exemption Checking (RTEC).

RCGP/RPS Repeat Prescribing Toolkit lunch and learn workshop Tickets, Multiple Dates | Eventbrite.

The Royal Pharmaceutical Society (RPS) and the Royal College of GPs (RCGP) recently released a practical toolkit designed to support General Practice teams and Primary Care Networks to improve the consistency, safety and efficiency of their repeat prescribing processes and systems.

To support GP teams and Primary Care Networks keen to implement the toolkit, the ICB have partnered with Health Innovation Kent Surrey Sussex (KSS HIN).

As a first step we are inviting colleagues from general practice and community pharmacy to attend an on-line lunchtime workshop, hosted by KSS HIN on Teams. Clare Howard, Clinical lead author and Fellow of the Royal Pharmaceutical Society will lead the session, outlining the contents of the toolkit and how to approach its implementation.

Tax credit exemptions no longer valid from 6 April 2025

From 5th April 2025, tax credit exemption certificates will no longer be valid for free NHS prescriptions, as patients transition from tax credits to Universal Credit, which does not automatically cover health costs, so patients must meet specific criteria or qualify for another exemption.

The 'Tax Credit exemption certificate' (EPS code 0013 or 'M' on paper forms) will

be removed from 6th April 2025. However, prescriptions dispensed before 5th April 2025 using this exemption category can still be claimed after the change.
