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National Flu Immunisation Programme 2025 to 2026 Letter

Please follow this link <u>National flu immunisation programme plan 2025 to 2026 - GOV.UK</u> to see the letter published today by NHSE, DHSC and UKHSA providing guidance for the 2025/26 flu vaccination programme.

The tripartite letter sets out who is eligible for a flu vaccine in autumn/winter 2025/26, which adult and child vaccines will be reimbursed and the timing of the programme to allow providers to plan for a successful vaccination campaign.

The eligible cohorts and the timing of the 2025/26 flu vaccination programme remain the same as the 2024/25 season. All flu vaccines recommended for 2025/26 are now trivalent formulations in line with JCVI advice, and aTIV (previously aQIV) is now licensed from 50 years and over.

Providers are asked to ensure that sufficient volumes of 1st line adult vaccines are ordered to meet anticipated demand and to start planning early to ensure successful delivery of the programme with the aim of improving uptake.

<u>Pharmacy Workforce Eary Careers Funding Support - Formal Expression of Interest</u>. *Deadline 28th February 2025*

Nationally, and within Kent and Medway, there is an identified workforce priority to ensure Newly Qualified and Early Careers Pharmacy Professionals are supported to meet the requirements of the Initial Education and Training of Pharmacists (IETP) reform work, as outlined in the NHS Long Term Workforce Plan.

This offer of expression of interest is open to all sectors of pharmacy in Kent and Medway providing care to NHS patients.

Once an expression of interest for an organisation has been completed, the person submitting the request will be contacted by NHS Kent and Medway Pharmacy Workforce Team to organise a Teams meeting to explore the request further. As part of this discussion, how the request meets individual development, organisation needs and local population health priorities will be questioned.

Deadline for completion of this funding request is 28th February 12 noon.

Inclusion criteria for funding consideration: Modules of early career PGCert and PGDip programmes for pharmacists (including generalist and specialist focussed programmes) Ø Post-registration Clinical Diploma modules for Pharmacy Technicians, Ø Pharmaceutical Technology & Quality Assurance (PTQA) courses Ø Accuracy Checking for Pharmacy Technicians Ø Other education programmes/modules and training requests will be considered if they benefit either individual or cohorts of Newly Qualified and/or Early Careers pharmacy professionals.

Exclusion criteria: This funding must not duplicate other nation, regional or local funding and investment streams from NHS England for example, Independent Prescribing, Adult Critical Care training for Pharmacy Professionals and any training already available through CPPE or the Pharmacy Integration Fund Ø Funding for supervision for the Newly Qualified Pharmacist Pathway in Acute, Mental Health and Community Health NHS Trusts Ø Individual requests for modules/programmes mapped to Advanced and Consultant level practice that do not benefit the Newly Qualified and/or Early Careers pharmacy workforce

EPS token submission and factsheet

Community Pharmacy England has published a new <u>factsheet</u> to help pharmacy teams familiarise themselves with Electronic Prescription Service (EPS) token submission requirements.

The factsheet outlines which tokens must be sent to the NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) as part of their end-of-month submission, including those for paid or exemption declarations and Pharmacy First consultations, and which are not required, such as those for age-exempt patients and where exemptions have been confirmed by Real Time Exemption Checking (RTEC).

Reporting Safety Incidents in Clinical Services using Learn from Patient Safety Events Service (LFPSE)

NHS Kent and Medway would like to remind pharmacies of the importance of reporting safety incidents. This includes those that result from commissioned clinical services and patient consultations.

Pharmacies must have a patient safety incident log for all incidents, which captures the information set out in the <u>Approved Particulars</u>. Patient safety incidents must be reported to the <u>Learn from Patient Safety Events Service</u> (<u>LFPSE</u>) and when reporting please use the defined levels of physical and psychological harm grades.

A record of the LFPSE report reference number should be kept within the pharmacy as part of the incident log.

Some ICBs have published a guide on what to include in a LFPSE report – the following is a link to the guide from Frimley ICB which may be helpful: What to include in a LFPSE report.
