Switching

Last year, prescription switching led to over £2 million in charges being deducted across all pharmacies due to unsigned FP10 paper prescriptions that were switched from exempt to paid by the NHSBSA.

To address this issue and explain what pharmacy teams can do to help prevent switching, CPE have produced a <u>short video guide</u>. Please review with your team.



LFD Update

Following an update to the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) <u>guidance on antiviral treatment for COVID-19</u>, which removes some of the cohorts of patients eligible for these treatments, these changes will also need to be reflected in the Lateral Flow Device (LFD) service.

The changes in the NICE guidance means the following patient cohorts are **no longer eligible** to receive free LFD tests through the service:

- People aged 85 years and over
- People with end-stage heart failure who have a long-term ventricular assistance device
- People on the organ transplant waiting list

- People resident in a care home who are aged 70 years and over
- People resident in a care home who have a BMI of 35 kg/m2 or more
- People resident in a care home who have diabetes
- People resident in a care home who have heart failure
- People currently in a hospital who are aged 70 years and over
- People currently in a hospital who have a BMI of 35 kg/m2 or more
- People currently in a hospital who have diabetes
- People currently in a hospital who have heart failure

Pharmacy owners are asked to brief their teams on the changes to the eligible patient cohorts for the service, update their standard operating procedure (SOP) for the service and stop supplying LFD tests to the above patient groups **by Monday 16th June 2025**.



Pharmacy Bundling

Pharmacy owners are reminded that, *from 1st June*, they must be registered and able to deliver the Hypertension Case Finding Service, the Pharmacy Contraception Service (PCS) **and** the Pharmacy First service, in addition to delivering the minimum number of clinical pathway consultations, to achieve the monthly fixed payment for Pharmacy First.

Changes from June will also include a new *fixed payment of £500* for pharmacy owners delivering a minimum of 20 to 29 clinical pathway consultations in a month, with the £1,000 maximum fixed payment for those delivering 30 or more consultations.
