NHS Prescription charges frozen for the second year running

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has announced that the NHS prescription charge will be kept at £9.90 per prescription item for 2026/27.

A <u>Government press release</u> today confirms that the NHS prescription charge will be frozen, as well as the costs for prescription prepayment certificates (PPCs). PPCs offer savings for those needing multiple prescription items or when a patient is prescribed a listed HRT medicine.

Community Pharmacy England will soon update its resources to help pharmacies communicate these charges to patients.
