2026/27 Community Pharmacy Assurance Framework (CPAF) screening questionnaire

Pharmacy owners should have received confirmation from NHSBSA that the 2026/27 CPAF screening questionnaire will be available for completion from 1st July 2026 until 31st July 2026. As a result of NHS regulations introduced at the end of 2020, completion of CPAF is a requirement of the Terms of Service. New Pharmacy Quality Scheme for 2026/27 announced

Full details of the Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS) 2026/27 are now available [here](#). Pharmacy owners will be able to claim an Aspiration payment if they wish to between 9am on 13th July 2026 and 11.59pm on 28th July 2026.

The declaration period for the 2026/27 PQS will be between 9am on 1st

February 2027 and 11.59pm on 26th February 2027, with pharmacy owners needing to have evidence to demonstrate meeting the domains that they have claimed for by the end of 31st March 2027.



Pharmacies to provide new MenB vac service

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and NHS England have announced a new community pharmacy vaccination service to provide a one-off Meningococcal B (MenB) Vaccination Service.

The new Advanced service is targeted to protect young people heading to universities or residential further education ahead of the start of term in autumn 2026. Click [here](#) to read more. The service specification for the Meningococcal B (MenB) Vaccination Service has now been published by NHS England. This follows [the initial announcement of the service](#) made by the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) on 12th June.

Pharmacy owners who decide to provide the service must first complete an [electronic registration declaration](#).

The deadline for registration is **11.59pm on 20th July 2026**.

However, pharmacy owners must register for the service **by 6th July 2026** if they would like to start offering appointments on National Booking Service (NBS) from the service commencement date (20th July). In that case, as long as they have a minimum of one booking made via NBS from 20th July, the pharmacy will

receive stock on time to administer it to the patient.

Registrations submitted after 20th July 2026 will not be accepted, and the pharmacy will not be able to provide the service. To read more please click [here](#)



Flu and Childhood flu vac: PGD and VGD published

NHS England has authorised and the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has published the Patient Group Direction (PGD) and Vaccine Group Direction (VGD) for use in the autumn/winter 2026/27 NHS Flu vaccination campaign.

VGDs are a new legal route which can be used to authorise administration of vaccines. In summary, they operate in a similar way to a PGD, with pharmacists and pharmacy technicians operating as the clinician, but with the opportunity for some tasks within the process (preparation, administration and record-keeping) to be delegated to other suitably trained staff.

Service Registration Reminder

Pharmacy owners who wish to provide either flu and COVID-19 vaccinations or only adult flu vaccinations as part of the autumn/winter 2026/27 campaign, but who have not yet registered to provide these services, can still do so by using the NHS Business Service Authority's [Manage Your Service \(MYS\) portal](#) to register to provide the service.

The interim deadline for registration is **11.59pm on 31st July 2026** to receive supplies of COVID-19 vaccines ahead of the anticipated autumn 2026 service commencement date.

If registering after 31st July 2026, the pharmacy is not guaranteed to receive COVID-19 vaccine in time for the COVID-19 vaccination commencement date.

The final deadline to register to provide flu and COVID-19 vaccinations or only adult flu vaccinations in 2026/27 is **11.59pm on 30th November 2026**.



Expanded Children's Flu Vac Advanced service to be launched in October

Following discussions with NHS England, Community Pharmacy England has agreed to an extension of the pilot flu vaccination service for children aged 2-3 years, with an increase in the fee. In addition, after successful lobbying, the service is being expanded to include opportunistic vaccination of two additional groups:

- Clinically at-risk children aged 2 years to less than 18 years; and
- Catch-up vaccinations of school-aged children (Reception to Year 11).

The service, which has been announced via an [amendment to the national flu letter](#) by the Department of Health and Social Care, the UK Health Security Agency and NHS England, will continue to be commissioned as an Advanced service. To read more, please click on [this link](#).



Expression of Interest

We are pleased to share that Community Pharmacy Kent has successfully secured funding through the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) to support this work. The aim of the project is to embed research within community pharmacy practice across Kent by April 2027 through study set-up, the development of research champions, and the creation of a stronger research culture within the sector.

Research is already well established in parts of primary care, including general practice, and there is now an opportunity to further develop this within community pharmacy. NIHR is seeking to expand research into this sector, recognising that pharmacies are highly accessible, embedded in local communities, and often support patients in areas of higher deprivation. This project will help build research capability in Kent pharmacies and support more inclusive, representative research in real-world community settings.

As part of this project, one community pharmacy site in Kent will be selected to participate. The selected pharmacy will nominate one pharmacist and one pharmacy technician to complete accredited Good Clinical Practice (GCP) training.
